Looking back over Summer Term

Student Leadership

The third term Student Council team has focused on whole school events including 'This is Me Day' and Sports Day. They have also been planning for next academic year focusing on promoting our Values Champions and school rewards.

Student Leaders who were involved in the 'Fix our Food' research project being led by The Food Foundation have been invited to Parliament in November 2023 for the next stage of the project.

The Year 10 boys football team celebrated their season success by having lunch at the University Of Bradford Stadium, which included a pitch side walk and photos in the stadium.

Values Champion

Values Champions were awarded for this term. Students are wearing their badges with pride and enjoying the use of the 'queue jumping' in the canteen.

Enrichment

This term's enrichment timetable has included: Jiu-Jitsu, Mindfulness, Archery, First Aid, Cricket and Computer Gaming.

As part of our connected curriculum, KS3 students were involved in a drop down Arts Day. The day included a number of workshops run by the Kala Sangam Project. The workshops allowed students to build confidence, communication and teamwork skills whilst being creative and expressive.

On 12th July 12 girls from Yr 9 and Yr 10 attended the first Girls in Sport Event at Bradford College. 96 girls from 5 schools across Bradford were in attendance. The event was delivered to increase girls' awareness and interest in careers in sport. The girls took part in 5 activity sessions led by coaches from a number of sporting settings; Bradford Bulls, Yorkshire Cricket, West Riding CFA. The girls also had the privilege of listening to some guest speakers including Harleen Kaur.

On Monday 3rd July we had our whole school 'The is Me Day', previously known as Culture day. The student council team were greatly influential with the plans for the day, which focused on South Asia, Africa and Britain. Each lesson involved a number of activities and refreshments throughout the day were chosen by the student council including different types of tea from around the world, scones and lunch included Indian cuisine.

Flags were hung in the atrium that represented our students' nationality. The day also included a number of students speaking within assemblies about their culture and heritage. Feedback detailed the day was a fantastic day of learning, trying new activities and focusing on the importance of diversity, tolerance and respect for all.

House System

Students have been involved in a number of house competitions including; Languages House Quiz, Year 7 Boys Football, Year 8 Boys Football, History Bingo.

The house winner for this academic year will be announced during celebration assemblies on the last day of term.

Careers

Yr 9 and Yr 10 students were involved in the Careers Fair on 4th July. The students had the opportunity to network with 16 local, national and international businesses. All students took an independent and active approach, engaging in conversations with representatives of the businesses. Feedback from business attendees and students was extremely positive.

Yr 10 students engaged in a virtual work experience between 4th July - 6th July. Students accessed 'The Forage', which has over 200 virtual work experience programmes to complete. Some students also engaged with Barclays Life Skills, the website has access to virtual work experience activities, information about sectors and employability skills.

Three Yr 10 students were successful applicants for the KPMG Future Leaders technology programme for girls. The programme was a 3-day programme; one virtual day and two days in person at the KPMG office based in Leeds. Throughout the three days the students heard from exciting speakers, discovered more about tech careers, learnt about KPMG and met women in the tech field. All 3 students really enjoyed the opportunity and all recommended the opportunity for students next year.

E-Safety

At One In A Million Free School, we appreciate that E-Safety is an important part of keeping children safe. We have security measures in place in school, which are constantly monitored, to help safeguard students from any potential online dangers. E- Safety is taught to all students explaining and demonstrating how to stay safe and behave appropriately online. However, One In A Million Free School can only be successful in keeping children safe online if we work with you as parent/carers to ensure the e-Safety message is consistent. Your help is needed. Talk to your children about how they can keep safe and behave appropriately online.

Actions may help safeguard your children online include:

- Install parental control software which allows you to limit sensitive information you
 don't want your child sharing (e.g., name, age, phone number).
- Make sure your browser is set to take advantage of built-in security and safety features - Look under "Tools," then "Internet Options."
- Turn on all the filtering and security features in your computer's search engine.
- Set high security and privacy settings with browsers, memberships, and social networking sites.
- Install and maintain Internet security software on all devices.
- Always read app/site ratings before allowing your children to visit/download.
- Check your browser's history to see which sites your children are visiting and how
 often.
- Limit younger children's online chatting, even within the friendly interface of a favourite game or club site. As they get older, introduce the concept of chatting with people they know.
- Make sure the computer or device your child uses is within your view, in a shared family space like the kitchen or living room.
- Teach your children to tell a parent/carer, teacher, or trusted adult if they feel uncomfortable about anything they've seen online.
- Always reinforce that your child needs to ask your permission before talking to anyone new online.
- Ask your child not to download files (e.g., music, games, screensavers, ring tones), make online purchases, or install software or apps without your permission.
- Talk about protecting private information and never sharing passwords with friends.

Uniform

All our students in Year 7 to 11 are expected to wear the approved school uniform.

A high standard of work and behaviour is expected from all our students and we believe these are helped by also having high standards of appearance.

All items of school uniform are worn conventionally and we expect parents/carers to support our reasonable requirements. We operate uniform checks each morning to ensure our students uphold our high standards with regard to the dress code and to check on essential items for a successful school day. If the correct uniform isn't being worn, students will be asked to change into school owned alternatives or they may be sent home to change.

Non uniform coats, hoodies or footwear should be removed before students enter the building and stored in their locker.
