PUNCTUALITY AND ATTENDANCE

As you aware from our previous communications, attendance above 96% is crucial in helping your child to reach their potential. You will be aware that improving attendance is a priority for us at One In A Million and your support is vital in helping us to achieve this goal.

Research has shown that pupils with attendance below 96% are at risk of dropping, on average, 1 full GCSE grade per subject.

We ask for your support in not removing students from school during term time so that they are not hindered in the progress that they can make as a result of missing vital work.

It is our responsibility to exhaust all possible means to improve attendance and as such, please be aware that in line with DfE (Department for Education) guidance, agreement with other local schools and in conjunction with the Local Authority we will issue penalty notices for holidays taken during term time.

MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

We are getting large numbers of students having to leave school during the day to attend appointments. It is extremely important that any appointments are scheduled for outside of school hours or either at the start or end of the school day. It is very disruptive when students have to leave school mid lesson and any lesson time lost can have a significantly detrimental effect on their learning. Please remember that if appointments are scheduled in school time, confirmation must be seen before students can leave the building.
