## Update from the Principal

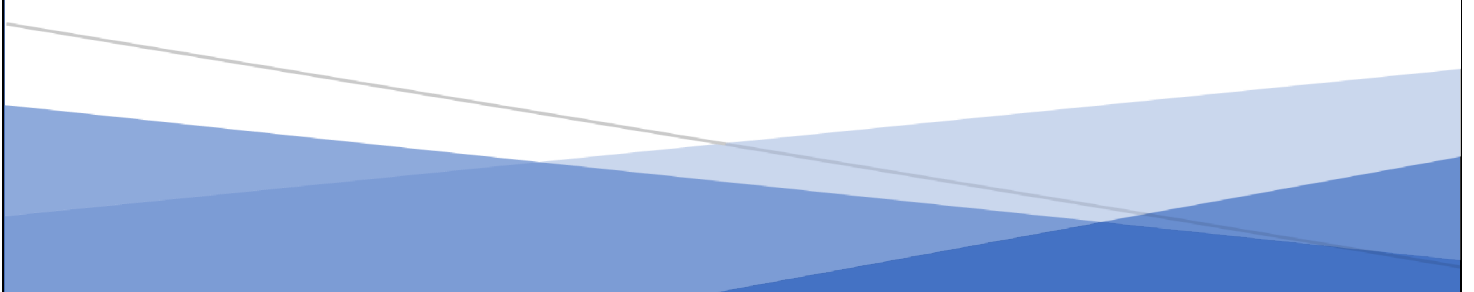
Welcome to this half term's newsletter.

Happy New Year Year 7!

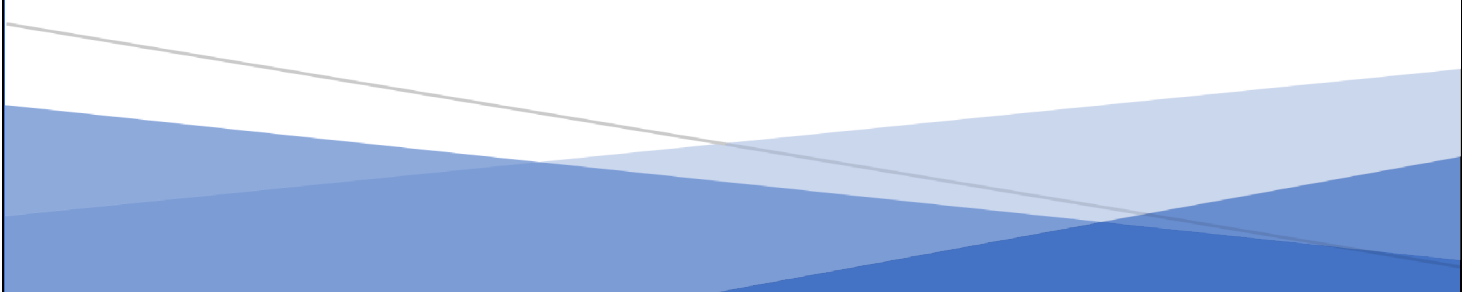

## Message for Year 9

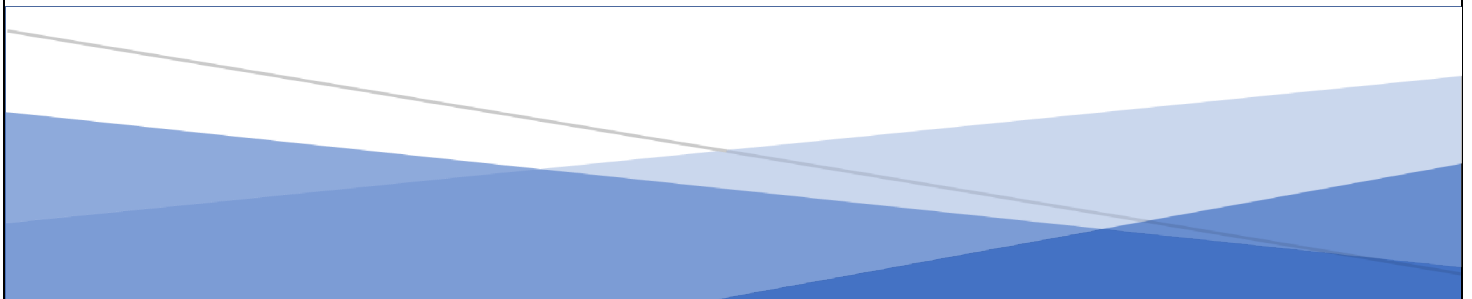
Year 9,

## Message for Year 11

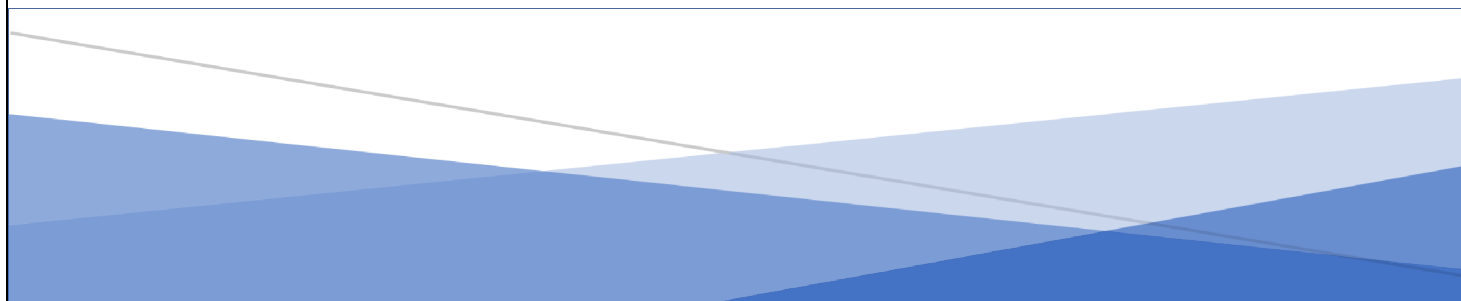
Year 11 students have started Half Term 3 by putting **first things first**. Year 11 have returned to school refreshed and ready to work hard with the end in mind.

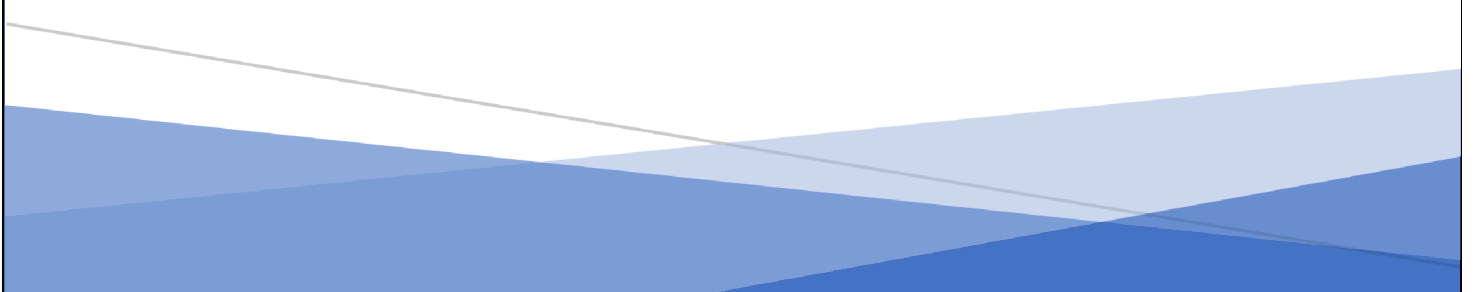
### House System

### Careers

Students have continued to have been involved in a number of Career based activities:

- Yr 11 have careers appointments with a Shine Careers advisor. They have also had support with next step destinations, applications, interview prep/tips and personal statements/CVs writing. Y11 students have also been involved with informative assemblies from Bradford New College, Bradford College and Dixons Sixth Form.
- Yr 9 and 10 - Students have completed a survey detailing the sectors they are most interested in working to support future planning.
- Yr 8 Participated in a Words for Work workshop which aims to equip students with communication skills for the world of work (supported by Provident Financial Group and National Literacy Trust).



## Woodhouse Grove

One In A Million Free School are now into their sixth year of their partnership with Woodhouse Grove, who award two full Sixth Form bursary places per annum to promising One In A Million Free School Year 11 students.

15 students were nominated by staff to attend an assembly hosted by Woodhouse Grove and past One In A Million Free School students who were successful in achieving a bursary.

They escorted him on a tour of the school and along with our other Year 11 leaders and the student council discussed their views about school, living in Bradford and the challenges of climate change.

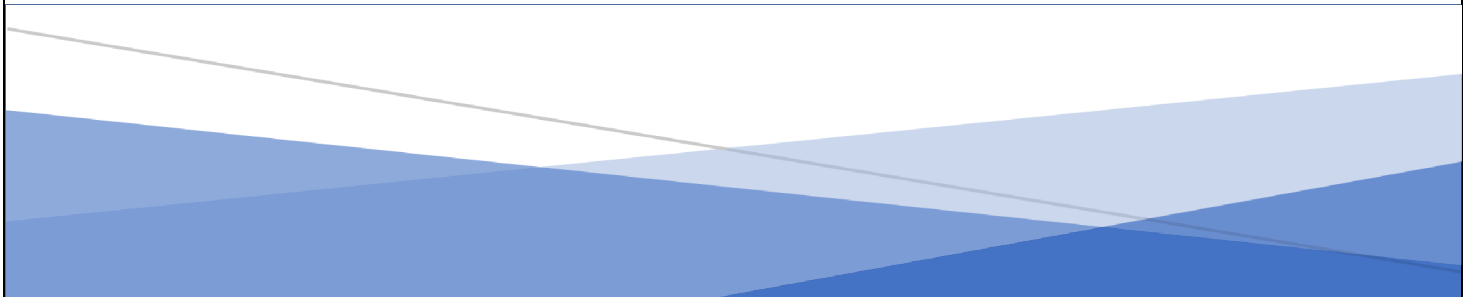
## Attendance Matters

Attending school on a regular basis is the key to students achieving or exceeding their potential. It sets students good routines for life and the working world. Being in school provides opportunities to socialise and feel included, learn new things, develop skills, increase confidence and self-esteem.

Students who have excellent attendance are eligible to take part in rewards events, attendance celebrations and prize draws throughout the academic year.

Attendance of 90% sounds positive but is equivalent of 19 days absent per year, and missing just 19 days of school per year (attendance of 90%) equals one GCSE grade dropped on average.

At One In A Million Free School, we expect students to achieve at least 97% attendance. We thank Parents/Carers who encourage their children to attend school every day.



## E-Safety

At One In A Million Free School, we appreciate that E-Safety is an important part of keeping children safe. We have security measures in place in school, which are constantly monitored, to help safeguard students from any potential dangers. E- Safety is taught to all students explaining and demonstrating how to stay safe and behave appropriately online. However, One In A Million Free School can only be successful in keeping children safe online if we work

with you as parent/carers to ensure the e-Safety message is consistent. Your help is needed to talk to your children about how they can keep safe and behave appropriately online.

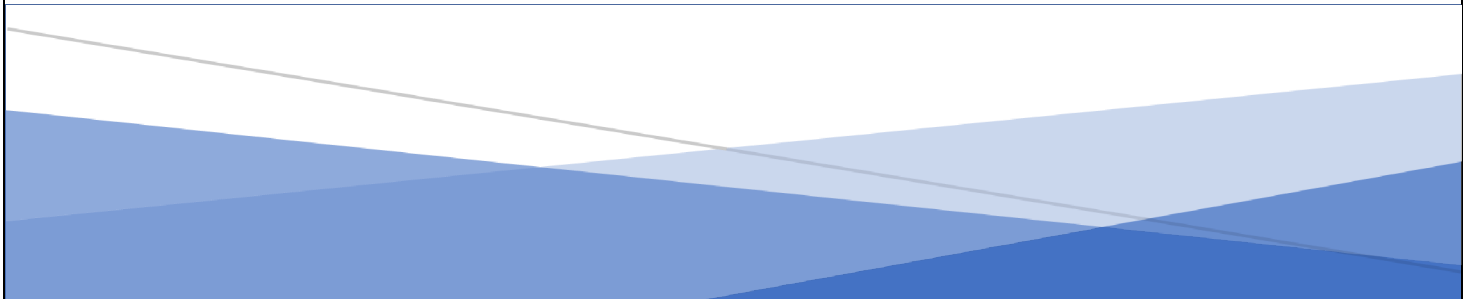
Actions which you may wish to take to help safeguard your children online include:

- Install parental control software which allows you to limit sensitive information you don't want your child sharing (e.g., name, age, phone number).
- Make sure your browser is set to take advantage of built-in security and safety features - Look under "Tools," then "Internet Options."
- Turn on all the filtering and security features in your computer's search engine
- Set high security and privacy settings with browsers, memberships, and social networking sites.
- Install and maintain Internet security software on all devices.
- Always read app/site ratings before allowing your children to visit/download.
- Check your browser's history to see which sites your children are visiting and how often.
- Limit younger children's online chatting, even within the friendly interface of a favourite game or club site. As they get older, introduce the concept of chatting with people they know.
- Make sure the computer or device your child uses is within your view, in a public space like the kitchen or family room.
- Teach your children to tell a parent, teacher, or trusted adult if they feel uncomfortable about anything they've seen online.
- Always reinforce that your child needs to ask your permission before talking to anyone new online.
- Ask your child not to download files (e.g., music, games, screensavers, ring tones), make online purchases, or install software or apps without your permission.
- Talk about protecting private information and never sharing passwords with friends.

# Uniform

All our students in Year 7 to 11 are expected to wear the approved school uniform. A high standard of work and behaviour is expected from all our students and we believe these are helped by also having high standards of appearance. All items of school uniform are worn conventionally and we expect parents/carers to support our reasonable requirements. We operate uniform checks each morning to ensure our students uphold our high standards with regard to the dress code and to check on essential items for a successful school day. If the correct uniform isn't being worn, students will be asked to change into school owned alternatives or they may be sent home to change.

Non uniform coats, hoodies or footwear should be removed before students enter the building and stored in their locker.
