What is on offer?

Chellow Heights Holiday activities include summer and holiday activities for children with additional needs. Activities may include using the swimming pool, hydrotherapy, sensory room, arts and crafts, rebound, soft play bikes and bouncy castles.

3) Beckfoot Phoenix School Stay & Play

What is on offer?

Beckfoot Phoenix Stay and Play schemes offer children, siblings and families the chance to have fun using the sensory room, soft play room, hydrotherapy, rebound room, sensory garden, bicycles and track, outdoor play equipment, food technology, quiet spaces and other activities including messy play and arts and crafts.

Who is it for?

Open to all families from Keighley and the surrounding area who have a child or children of any age who have special needs and their siblings.

How do I access this?

Stay & Play sessions run during February, Easter, May and Summer school holidays. Each play session costs £4 for one child and £1 extra for any other child you bring. There is a £5 yearly membership cost. If you would like to do popular activities such as rebound, hydrotherapy sessions and swimming, then it is advisable to book early. Families can buy food and drinks from the café area or are welcome to bring a packed lunch.

4) Specialist Inclusion Project - Bradford Families

What does the Specialist Inclusion Project do?

The Specialist Inclusion Project is a team that specialises in researching, identifying, running and monitoring *Short Breaks* services for young people with disabilities aged 8 to 18 years throughout the Bradford District. These include after school, evening, weekend and half term short breaks. The team offer their own short breaks services including popular after school clubs themed around dance and drama, supported swimming sessions and the Pineapples Summer Camp - a 4 night residential during the summer holidays.

The team also run the *Link Work* service which focuses on finding suitable and sustainable short breaks activities for young people with disabilities. These activities are based on each young person's choice made through a link work assessment which identifies their likes and hobbies. The team work closely with a wide selection of short breaks providers in the Bradford district to identify different activities and monitor their work to ensure a high level of service.

Who is the Specialist Inclusion Project for?

The Specialist Inclusion Project will accept referrals for young people aged 8 to 17 ½ years, but work with young people aged 8 to 18. To find out if your child or young person is eligible and for further information, please contact the team on 01274 438744, or register your interest below:

Who is eligible?

Our criteria for Tier 2 Short breaks are as follows, young people must:

Have a diagnosed disability

Be aged 8-18

Must not currently have a social worker involved

Not be currently accessing any other after school/ evening club or group unless wanting to change their current one

Not be in receipt of any Direct Payment or Personalised/Individual budget unless wanting to change this

How to I access this?

To access activities your child/children must be referred to SELFA by a professional working with them or their family. This can be a class or head teacher, social worker, support worker, health visitor or other agency such as Carers' Resource or Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS).

All referrals are made online using the link at the top of the page. The form must be completed in full, giving the reason for referral. Providing full information helps us give appropriate support and gauge the level of need.

Once registered with us, the parent/carer will be added to our mailing list and receive details of planned activities. Professionals: please note that we do not have the resources to send information by post or contact each parent directly so please provide an email address.

What is on offer?

A range of activities designed to be fun and healthy and to encourage wellbeing through exercise, sport and membership, for individuals or groups in clubs or classes. Mixed ability sports in Bradford include: football, cricket, rugby, rowing, archery, boxing (non-contact), wheelchair basketball, tennis, golf, bowls, dance and swimming

Who is it for?

For people of all abilities and ages! Coaches are aware that many participants may have been inactive or face barriers to participation through inactivity, long term health problems or disability. Women or men only groups/teams, archery and football. Rugby is full contact for males 17+ although there is provision for non-contact 'touch' rugby for juniors and women.

How do I access it?

Classes are open to all and run at various locations throughout the district. There is usually a sessional charge or membership fee.

An educational class for adults with intellectual impairment or for people on the autistic spectrum is available for those members who take up a mixed ability activity in the region. The organisation (International Mixed Ability Sports) exists to promote fully inclusive community activities and those members have the opportunity through this class to share their experiences and become part of the IMAS training team.

Sports activities are open to people of any ability or disability. The educational class is primarily to promote the mixed ability model and we require students to be members of mixed ability activities or clubs.

Who is it for?

Adults with ADHD and parents/carers of children with ADHD.

What is on offer?

We are a peer-led voluntary support group offering a wide range of support to both adults with ADHD and parents/carers of children with ADHD (with or without a diagnosis). We

have two meetings a month (one in Wakefield and one in Dewsbury) and arrange social activities during school holidays.

You/your child does not need a diagnosis to join our group. If you suspect that you/your child may have ADHD, you are very welcome to join us. The support we offer is tailored to the individuals needs and includes listening to concerns and providing moral support, providing information on ADHD and co-morbid conditions and giving practical advice on coping strategies.

Due to having first-hand experience of the condition we are able to offer an understanding, which can often be lacking, leaving parents feeling very isolated. We also work closely with other groups, offering advice on ADHD, which enables us to signpost effectively where appropriate, thus maximising the help available to clients and enabling people to get in touch with each other.

SNOOP (Special Needs Objective Outreach Project is a registered charity based in Eccleshill and welcoming families from across the Bradford Metropolitan District. We provide a wide range of services to support children and young adults with additional needs and disabilities aged 0-25 years + and give support and information to their parent/carers. Open 50 weeks of the year and offering flexibility to parent/carers to support them to work or further their education and training. We have a team of highly qualified and experienced staff who are happy to meet with you, show you around and discuss your needs and the needs of your child.

Who is it for?

We provide a wide range of services for children and young adults of all abilities between the ages of 2 – 25+ years. All our services for children use play work and early years foundation skills aiming to help a child to develop their social skills and friendships. As your child matures, we provide transition services to support a young adult to learn social skills, life and independence skills through a range of activities both during the day and in the evening in our Young Adults Service for those with learning disabilities. We aim to offer a varied and stimulating range of activities based on a person centred approach, encouraging the aspirations of the young people we support, whilst also being aware of the need for relaxation. Our range of services include

- After school sessions and holiday play schemes (2 16 years)
- Day time and evening support for young adults with learning disabilities (16 -25+ years)
- ASDAN Accredited Awards for life and independence skills

• support for parents / carers at education, health and social care reviews and or assessments for their child / young adult * Youth Club – The 'Chillin Zone' (13-25 years) for young people with additional needs and their siblings

• Stay and Play sessions (pre-5's); sensory room, sensory integration swings and soft play centre

How do I access this?

Your child or young adult does not have to have referral from a professional to access our services, you can contact us direct. SNOOP operates from our own purpose built, fully accessible centre, the building is all on one level and has ample parking facilities. SNOOP also has a fully accessible personal hygiene room with changing table, hoist and tracking to ensure the privacy of children and young adults with disabilities when intimate care is being provided. You can pay for the service yourself or use your personal budget, direct payments, short breaks or Individual Service Funds to purchase your place.

Most of our other galleries will be open for families to explore and play with interactive exhibits

The Kodak Gallery will have screens and sounds turned off to ensure a quieter space

29) DLA Days out Facebook group

30) Carers go free at theme parks

With the right support, theme parks can be fantastic autism-friendly days out. The person with the disability or additional need will usually pay the full entrance fee – unless you have a discount voucher – with a free carer ticket/concession for the main carer. Some parks offer more than one concession if extra support is required. Contact each venue direct to ask for the concessions as these are subject to change.

31) Relaxed cinema screenings

The main cinema chains offer special screenings for people with autism, where special adjustments are made; low lights, low sound levels, no trailers or adverts, and guests are allowed to move around and make noise. Some charities such as Mencap, also run occasional free film screenings throughout the year, which can make for a great autism-friendly day out.

These cinema chains all offer autism-friendly screenings: <u>Cineworld</u>, <u>Everyman</u>, <u>Odeon</u>, <u>Picturehouse</u>, <u>Showcase</u>, <u>Vue</u>.

32) <u>Family Fund</u>

What is it?

Family Fund is the UK's largest charity providing grants for families raising disabled or seriously ill children and young people. Last year, we provided over 150,000 grants or services worth over £48 million to families across the UK.

Our purpose is to improve the lives of low-income families raising disabled or seriously ill children and young people.

Our mission is to provide items and services to all low-income families in the UK raising disabled or seriously ill children, that they could not otherwise afford or access, and that help improve their quality of life, realise their rights, and remove some of the barriers they face.

Our vision is that all families raising disabled or seriously ill children have the same choices, quality of life, opportunities and aspirations as other families.

What is on offer?

We provide grants for a wide range of items, such as washing machines, sensory toys, family breaks, bedding, tablets, furniture, outdoor play equipment, clothing and computers. It can be a struggle financially, emotionally and physically for families raising a disabled or seriously ill child, and these grants help break down many of the barriers families face, improving their quality of life and easing the additional daily pressures.

33) <u>Max Card (Discounts)</u>

What is on offer?

AWARE issues Max Cards to AWARE members who have children with additional needs. Families simply show their Max Card upon entry to a venue in order to obtain free or discounted admission, or occasionally you may need to book ahead.. The scheme is designed to help these families save money on great days out at castles, zoos, bowling alleys and more. The Max Card Scheme aims to provide a sense of community through stimulating learning experiences and enjoyable days out for everyone. Who is it for?

AWARE families who have a child(ren) with a disability or additional need in receipt of DLA or PIP at any level to qualify. Cards can be used for young adults up to 25, so you may apply until your young person reaches their 23rd birthday.

How do I access this?

34) The Cinema Exhibitors Association Card

What is on offer?

The card is part of a national card scheme accepted by UK participating cinemas. The card allows you to obtain one free ticket for any person with additional needs to the cinema. One full price ticket for a film needs to be brought at the same time to use the card.

Who is it for?

To qualify a young person needs to be over eight years of age, and be getting Disability Living Allowance (DLA), Personal Independent Payment (PIP) or be registered as blind.

How do I access this?

You can apply online by going to the website below, or ask about the card at your local cinema where you can pick up an application form. There is a £6 fee and the card lasts for one year from the date of issue.

36) Sunflower Lanyard Scheme

What is it?

The Sunflower Lanyard Scheme

The Sunflower is a globally recognised symbol for non-visible disabilities, also known as hidden disabilities or invisible disabilities.

Not all disabilities are visible – some are not immediately obvious: including autism, chronic pain, and learning difficulties as well as mental health conditions, mobility, speech impairments, and sensory loss such as speech, sight loss, hearing loss, or deafness. They also include respiratory conditions as well as chronic conditions such as diabetes, chronic pain, and sleep disorders when these significantly impact day-to-day life. Although you may not be able to see these invisible impairments and conditions, they are still there.

People living with these often face barriers in their daily lives including a lack of understanding and negative attitudes, so some choose to wear the Sunflower Lanyard to

discreetly identify that they may need support, help, or just a little more time in shops, transport, or public spaces.

AWARE is excited to announce a new partnership with the organisation Carefree, who offer breaks for unpaid carers.

Carefree organises breaks for carers aged 21+ who are classed as full-time carers.

98% of Carefree's recipients of their breaks report an improvement in their wellbeing after using their services, while 86% would not have had a break without their help.

AWARE members can refer themselves directly or be referred via our staff.

The accommodation is free on each break; you will need to pay a £25 administrative fee and cover costs such as transport and food while you are on your break.

You will also need to organise childcare/respite care unless you are going on the break with a friend or other family member and have a partner who can provide care while you are away.

42) Assistance at the Airport

How do I request help?

Airlines, travel agents and tour operators should provide a free method of requesting assistance when you book (or at later stage). You may be asked about special assistance during the booking process but this isn't standard practice so you may need to make a request - preparation is key!

If you are booking on a website, look out for a special assistance link for information on how to get the type of help that you need.

Your travel service provider may ask you to telephone them or their agent or complete a web form. Many airlines provide a Freephone or local rate number for you to call to notify them of your assistance needs; some airlines also offer a free call-back option.

Request and keep written or printed confirmation of your assistance booking.

What can I ask for?

It is important that you are clear about the type of help that you need; this will help avoid delays and ensure that you receive appropriate support. Many airports also provide additional information tailored specifically to people with hidden disabilities.

This could include:

- transfer from a designated point, such as car park or bus stop, to the terminal building
- the use of an airport wheelchair to get to the gate
- extra help getting through security searches
- assistance with boarding the aircraft and getting seated
- specific seats on the aircraft

Airlines will need to know if:

- You are taking an electric mobility aid (e.g. an electric wheelchair or mobility scooter)
- Your condition means that you need extra care and attention

Questions that you may wish to consider in advance include:

- Are on-board wheelchairs available on all aircraft? These are used to move people to the toilet during the flight.
- What are the walking distances to departure gates? Airports should provide this information on their websites.
- Does the airport uses air bridges or steps for passengers to board aircraft?
- The number and type of accessible toilets at the airport and on board aircraft.
- What restrictions (e.g. safety, weight, space, battery type) apply to the carriage of electric mobility aids.
- The airline's policies in relation to compensating for damaged mobility equipment.
- The types of seats available and how the airline allocates these.
- Restrictions on medication at security searches (especially relating to liquids).

Invisible Disabilities at Manchester Airport

We are working on ways to identify how we can improve the airport experience for our vulnerable passengers who may not want to share details of their invisible disabilities or use our assistance service.

If this applies to you or someone you're travelling with, we can offer you a special lanyard to wear on your journey through our airport. This will identify you to staff as someone who may need additional support or understanding. Our staff have been specially trained to recognise the lanyards and act accordingly. Please note this lanyard permits access to our family and priority lanes at security as well as the use of our special assistance lanes at the UK Border on arrival into Manchester Airport.

To pick up a lanyard at Manchester, please go to one of our Assistance Reception areas. These are available within our Check-in halls in Terminal 1 A and B, Terminal 2 and Terminal 3. We will be happy to give you a lanyard, even if you haven't requested or need special assistance. Please note, due to high demand, we are unable to post a lanyard to your home address in any circumstance. Please collect a lanyard from our assistance desk in the departure hall on your day of travel (or see below re the Lanyard scheme)

The Sunflower Room

The Sunflower Room in Terminal 1 is to aid Special Assistance Guests who need to break away from the noise, bright lights and crowds of the main Departure Lounge to help them relax and feel calm in a quieter environment.

Guests who require use of the room will be guided here as part of the Special Assistance Service.
